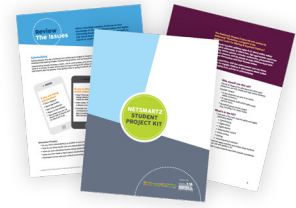
Activity Guides

Interactive games that help children review online safety issues in fun and unique ways.



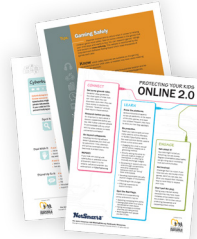
Peer Education & Leadership Kits

Scripted PowerPoint® presentations describing the main online safety issues and how to address them.



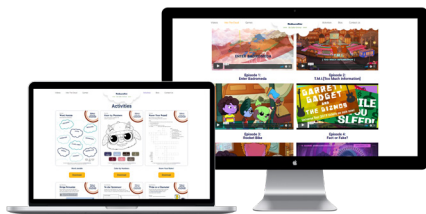
